PRIVACY POLICY

It is informed to all interested parties that SCALA HIGHER EDUCATION S.C., a company identified with NIF/RFC. SHE1110145H4 with address at Calzada de la Naranja N°159, Fraccionamiento Industrial Alce Blanco, C.P. 53370 Naucalpan, State of Mexico, 4th Floor, properly constituted (from now on "SCALA"). In accordance with the Federal Law of Personal Data Protection, as well as what is reflected in the current European regulatory framework according to the GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation) 2016/679 of April 27, (from now "The Legislation"), is the owner of the website www.scalalearning.com (from now the "Website").

The present Privacy Policy (from now, the "Privacy Policy") is intended to inform you how SCALA defines and uses your Information.

Your access and use of the Website implies your full acceptance of this Privacy Policy (available at www.scalalearning.com). Any changes will be informed and published in a timely manner on the website itself, property of SCALA.

I. DEFINITIONS

For all purposes, the following terms will be applicable to this Policy:

- Consent of the person concerned: Every expression of free, specific, informed and unequivocal consent by which the concerned person agrees, either by a declaration or by a clear affirmative action, to the processing of personal data concerning him/her.
- **Privacy notification:** Verbal or written communication generated by the responsible, addressed to the data owner for the processing of their personal data, through which he/she is informed about the existence of the information processing policies that will be applicable, the way to access them and the purposes of the processing that is intended to be given to the personal data.
- **Data file:** Any structured set of personal data, accessible according to specific standards, whether centralized, decentralized or distributed functionally or geographically.

 Public data includes, among others, data relating to the civil status of individuals, their profession or trade, and their status as merchants or public servers. By their essence, public data may be contained, among others, in public records, public documents, official gazettes and bulletins, and duly executed court rulings that are not subject to confidentiality.
- Sensitive data: Sensitive data are understood as the data that affect the privacy of the owner or whose inappropriate use may generate discrimination, such as those that reveal racial or ethnic origin, political orientation, religious or philosophical convictions, membership in syndicates, social organizations, human rights or which promote the interests of any political force or which guarantee the rights and guarantees of opposition political parties, as well as data related to health, sexual life, and biometric data.
- **Data Processor:** Natural or juridical person, public or private, which by itself, carries out the processing of personal data on behalf of the controller.
- Treatment Manager: Natural or juridical person, public authority, service or other organism that, by itself or with others, determines the purposes and means of the processing. Based on the law and criteria established by the State of Mexico or the European Union.
- Owner: Natural person who is the owner of the personal data being processed.

- Transfer: The transfer of data takes place when the controller and/or processor of personal data, located in Mexico, sends the information or personal data to a recipient, who is responsible for the processing and is located inside or outside the country.
- **Transmission:** Processing of personal data that involves the communication of such data within or outside the territory of the State of Mexico when the purpose of the processing is to be carried out by the processor on behalf of the controller.
- **Treatment:** Any operation or set of operations performed on personal data or sets of personal data, whether or not by automated processes, such as collection, recording, organization, structuring, storage, adaptation or alteration, extraction, consultation, use, disclosure by transmission, dissemination or otherwise making available, alignment or combination, restriction, erasure or destruction.

II. WHAT INFORMATION WE TREAT ON THE WEBSITE?

III. IDENTIFICATION OF THE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE TREATMENT OF PERSONAL DATA

IV. DATA TREATMENT

A. Data processed on SCALA's services

- Personal data provided in the forms for requesting information, such as name, surname, telephone number, country, organization or service of interest.
- We will treat the data contained in the documents you send us during the process of contracting or provision of product or service, within the contractual framework between the parties.

- We will treat, as is, the information you provide through the use of cookies if you consent to the agreement of cookies, according to SCALA's cookie policy (available at www.scalalearning.com).
- Concerning the information that you may provide us by telephone, we inform you that we have a call recording system to guarantee the management of the quality of the telephone service. Through the acceptance of this document, you agree to the use of the data provided in our data collection form for the issuance of commercial calls offering our services, as well as the recording of these for the purposes of quality and service claims indicated.

B. Purposes of data processing (all of them with the legitimacy contained in art. 6.1 of the GDPR):

- Contact you through the necessary means, including electronic means, in your contact details, provided by you, in order to provide you with information related to SCALA's corporate purpose. This information will include commercial information and general information about SCALA.

C. For how long will we keep your data?

D. Obligation to provide the data and consequences of not providing them: the different information collection forms will indicate which data are mandatory to complete the different requests. Without the provision of these, it won't be possible to execute your request.

E. Recipients of the data:

- SCALA relies on the collaboration of service providers and information technology providers who process data on behalf of and for our company. In these cases, after performing a strict selection control of the supplier based on the guarantees of compliance with data protection regulations, we will sign the relevant data processing contract with these entities. These providers give appropriate safeguards and may only use your data for what is strictly necessary in connection with the purposes described above. These entities will have access to the data in their capacity as data processors, and will only process the information following specific instructions on behalf of SCALA. We inform that in such events SCALA will adopt all the necessary measures so that the persons who have access to the Personal Data comply with SCALA's Personal Data Processing and Protection Policy and with the applicable legislation.
- **F. Rights of data owners:** Personal data owners have the rights of access, rectification, deletion, limitation, portability, opposition, as well as the right to file a complaint before the competent authority on data protection, which in legal rights they are entitled to.

In the case that the parties fail to settle the dispute within a maximum period of one (1) month from the date of notification by either side to its counterpart of the existence of the dispute, the parties shall submit the resolution of such dispute to the ordinary law.
